

HB 73: Requiring the coverage of Biomarker testing by health insurance under the Health Care Purchasing Act. This provides New Mexicans under group health care and self-insurance the reassurance that biomarker testing is covered if/when needed to be performed.

HB 191: HB 191 increases the amount of money that is annually transferred to the Early Childhood Education and Care Program fund. This allows for more money to be put into education which in turn better the education of all New Mexican children starting from an early age.

HB 234: This bill focuses on the reduction of shoplifting and aggravated shoplifting by creating penalties under law. Such penalties include petty misdemeanors up to fourth degree felony charges. This helps keep New Mexicans and businesses safe!

HB 353: Authorizes the issuance of bonds secured by a state gross receipts tax increment for the south campus tax increment development district.

HB 357: HB 357 concentrates on the creation of the "law enforcement workforce capacity building fund" to support efforts to increase the available workforce of law enforcement officers, including initiatives to recruit and retain high-quality law enforcement officers. It also focuses on the creation of the Public Attorney Workforce Capacity Building fund, and the Detention and Corrections Workforce Capacity Building fund. This helps provide funding for the recruitment and retention of law enforcement officers, detention officers, public defenders and prosecutors to help keep New Mexicans safe.

HB 379: Ensures that the governing body of a municipality, county, or other governmental entity allows for the use of a refrigerator that is as an acceptable alternative or substitute for a class 1 or class 2 substance by the United States environmental protection agency. The installation and listing of the equipment that contains a refrigerant designated meets the required safety standards.

SB 35: Focuses on the revision of practice requirements and employment conditions relating to anesthesiologist assistants. This also increases the number of anesthesiologist assistants that an anesthesiologist may supervise and requires in-person supervision. Not only does this protect and ensure the knowledge of anesthesiologist assistants, but also increases the number of service providers and assistants to rural areas of the state.

SB 107: This bill focuses on the safety of children and their wellbeing. SB 107 extends the period for filing a petition and providing notice regarding child abuse and neglect. Restricts the return of a child if they are taken into custody more than once in six months. This helps ensure the safety and wellbeing of the children of New Mexico as much as possible.
